SMARTER BOATING

Operator Competency Requirements

Operators of power-driven pleasure craft must obtain and carry proof of competency on board at all times. This is the law. It applies to all operators of power boats, personal watercraft and motorized sailing craft that are used for recreational purposes within Canada. A Pleasure Craft Operator Card (or a boating safety course certificate completed prior to April 1, 1999) is recognized as proof of competency. Once obtained, your Pleasure Craft Operator Card is good for life. **By September 15, 2009 everyone must have an Operator Card.**

The purpose of the Gravenhurst Environmental Advisory Committee (GEAC) is to advise and assist Council in promoting the protection, maintenance and enhancement of all aspects of the environment in order to improve the quality of life of those who live, work in, and visit the Town of Gravenhurst. In addition, the Gravenhurst Environmental Advisory Committee will assist with long range planning to support the sustainability of the community for the benefit of present and future generations.

As the representative for this area I will keep the Morrison Lake residents up to date as initiatives are undertaken by this committee.

Help keep our water clean:

Do....

- Buy phosphate-free soaps, shampoos, cleansers and detergents (especially dishwasher detergent)
- Maintain a natural shoreline with trees and bushes that absorb nutrients before they reach the water
- Keep organic matter such as raked leaves and garden clippings away from the water. Establish a composting area away from streams, rivers and lakes to help reduce nutrient rich runoff.

Don't...

- Bathe or shampoo in the lake
- Use fertilizers anywhere near the water
- Alter the natural shoreline by adding sand or other fill
