Superb regatta at Morrison Lake

Everything that goes to make a regatta a memorable event was present over the Civic Holiday weekend as the Morrison Lake Cottagers Association held their annual Morrison Lake Regatta.

The weather was perfect, all regatta events were on schedule and beautifully performed and the lake people were friendly and opened their hearts to the visitors who lined the shoreline to see the show.

Things kicked off Friday evening with a fireworks display and several cottage parties. On Saturday the preliminary water-ski trials were run off and at 1 o'clock the judging for the fleet of decorated boats and canoes was held at the waterfront at The Store where most events were centred.

The first prize for decorated canoe went to Edith and Fred Gray with "Maggie the Morrison Muskie". First prize for decorated boats went to the King family for "The Frog", 2nd place went to the LeMoine family for "Lollypop", 3rd place was captured by the Reynolds family for their entry "Chicken of the Sea" and the 4th place award went to the Griffith family for "Just Married".

Following the judging which was done by Chris Manewell. Bert Lundy and Howard Flemming over three dozen boats passed from one end of the lake to the other in the giant Boat Parade led by the fireboat spewing a jet stream of water and clanging its fire bell. It took over an hour to make the tour with

the shoreline at most cottages crowded with spectators cheering the boaters on.

In the afternoon the swim contest for all age groups took place at Evan's Beach with the Junior Olympic events taking place at The Store as well as the horseshoe pitching contest. In the evening the teenage disco dance was held at the Lodge,

Sunday was the big day for the regatta and drew a huge crowd at The Store. The cross-the-lake swim was held as were the canoe races for all age groups and sexes and the three-legged race and egg tossing contest was also part of the program. The big event which drew rave notices and applause was the spectacular Water-Ski Show that included a five-girl team passing in review carrying flags, a barefoot ski show, a three man pyramid, some zany water skiing clowns and a superb water ski kite flying exhibition, all performed by local cottagers.

The Baking contest was judged by Nonie Lundy, Aggie Purpura and Celia Reynolds. The best pie award went to Lynn Bennett, the best cake award went to Edith Gray and the most creative entry prize went to Sherry Bennett and Shirley Meyer. The best entry for the under 15 years of age group was captured by Michelle LeMoine.

The co-chairmen of the regatta were Jo-Anne Reynolds and Bob Leeder and they received full co-operation from all the cottagers including the Morrison Mudders, the horseshoe pitching team and their

ladies. Dave Manewell the unofficial mayor of the holiday resort acted as emcee for all events. He is also the current association president.

Wheele tre already in motion to make the 1979 edition of the Morrison Lake Regatta even bigger and better. This was announced at the awards presentation Sunday afternoon. The weekend came to a close Sunday evening with an adult dinner-dance in the Lodge.

She will be missed by all of her children: Leanne & Dan Pascoe, Melanie & Brian Hartman, David & Sheri Batchelor, Kellie & Jeff Barker; brother Paul Kelly & wife Sue and their family; along with her many long time friends on Morrison Lake.

Gord Kobe 1962-2015

Gord Kobe passed away on September 26, 2015 overlooking the lake that he loved so much, surrounded by his wife, Angie, and children, Megan and Lucas. Gord first came to Morrison Lake at the age of 17 when Brad Fairbrass, a fellow Orr Lake resident, invited him to go to a party at the Buschke cottage. That was the first of many visits to the lake for parties, regattas, and his favourite sport – water skiing. In 2004 Gord and Angie bought a cottage on the lake, and became permanent residents in 2008.

Gord was actively involved in the lake and community in a number of ways. He was a past president and vice president of the lake association. Gord was always there when anyone needed help on the lake – putting in and taking out docks, repairing boats and almost anything around the cottage, cutting up fallen trees after storms, lifting docks off of boats, etc. He could be found every year during the regatta helping out at the ski competition, the bike ride, and the ski show. Gord was also involved in several renovations to people's homes and cottages around the lake. He was a member of the executive of the Snow Crest Riders Snowmobile Club, as well as the Gravenhurst Environmental Committee.

DID YOU KNOW?

(Submitted by a group of concerned cottagers)

That some Morrison Lake Cottagers:

- are afraid to swim/let kids play in the water in front of their cottages
- watch with concern as skiers nudge a buoy that is marking a two foot wide rock sitting less that two feet under the water
- have to change their water filters every two weeks
- have to tell renters and visitors to use the lake with caution

WHY? Because cottagers facing the shallows on the North Shore often experience hours of continuous fast boat activity with skiers & boarders taking multiple runs over long periods of time.

While it is ideal to have great calm water for skiing, boarding and barefooting and while the showmanship if often enjoyed by those on the shore, it would be greatly appreciated if the boaters had a little more consideration to:

- their proximity to the shore & the wake the boats put up
- the frequency of their trips up and down the shoreline
- the distance their boats are from all the buoys

Provincial Legislation requires boaters to observe the rule limiting the speed limit to 10kph within 30 metres of shore. The North Shore owners do not want to restrict skiers, boarders, wake boats however... some greater consideration must be taken.

The Lake of Bays Association has implemented a "Boat Right, Be Polite" campaign. The campaign has the following features

- Keep at least 300 metres off shore and in open water! The 30 metres from shore limit is not enough to dissipate your wake.
- Don't swing your riders in front of other people's docks.
- Avoid multiple runs in the same area.


And a reminder that the speed limit is 10 kph within 30 metres of shore. You can take off from shore at speed only if you drive straight out from the shore.

Water levels and flows across much of central Ontario remained elevated this week, due to past precipitation and snow melt, and are currently stable or receding at most gauging stations, according to recent statements issued by the Surface Water Monitoring Centre. Sections of Ontario cottage country, including Muskoka, Bancroft, the Gull River and other areas, have experienced **high water** in recent weeks, and the Muskoka Lakes Association (MLA) has created a new Task Force to investigate recent water and ice damage to docks and boathouses in that region. **FOCA met with the Task Force** representatives from MLA on April 19th in Bracebridge, to discuss next steps. On July 11th, 2016 MPAC will be mailing Property Assessment Notices to residential property owners in your Municipality.

MPAC's Municipal and Stakeholder Relations team is committed to supporting municipalities throughout the 2016 Assessment Update and beyond.

As many homeowners are likely to turn to you for information about their property assessments, we have prepared a 2016 Assessment Update communications toolkit to help you.(attached)

In addition to general information about MPAC and property assessment, the toolkit includes:

- Residential notice mailing dates & local MPAC contacts
- How to find out more about property assessment through AboutMyProperty.ca
- How to file a Request for Reconsideration
- Information about the Assessment Review Board, as well as
- Web tools, including
- Twitter and Facebook messages and responses
- A widget providing a direct link to <u>AboutMyProperty.ca</u> and
- Other helpful links

The Generic "Buckslip" (mail out insert) is also attached and may be something to consider sending out with your tax bills should you choose. MPAC can customize for municipalities, so please let me know if you are interested. We will update the design to incorporate your municipal logo and add the mailing dates and which icons you would like included. Municipalities' would have to print their own but can consider this insert option which was created to fit inside tax bills so is envelope size. (to fit all the content in, the font size is 7.5 on one side and 8.5 on the other)

These tools are to help municipalities and municipal staff respond to property owners. We also have new brochures for your front counter. Please use the brochures as handouts, if needed. These should be made available to the public at the time of the Property Assessment Notice mail-out.

If you have not yet received MPAC's 2016 brochures I will be delivering them over the next couple weeks. I will also be providing this information catered to your specific Municipality on a USB key for ease of downloading onto your computers. If you need assistance or have any other questions, please call me at 705-774-4470.
